1 COPYRIGHT ASSIGNMENT

In consideration for the publication of the Contribution in the Journal, I hereby assign to the International Association for Feminist Economics (IAFFE) the copyright in the Contribution and in any abstract prepared by me to accompany the Contribution for the full legal term of copyright. This assignment includes the rights (i) to publish, reproduce, distribute, display, and store the Contribution worldwide in all forms, formats, and media now known or hereafter developed, including print, electronic, and digital forms; (ii) to translate the Contribution into other languages, create adaptations, summaries, or extracts of the Contribution or other derivative works based on the Contribution (as to which all provisions of section 1(i) above shall apply); and (iii) to sublicense all such rights. I understand that in the event the Contribution is not accepted and published in the Journal or is withdrawn by me before acceptance, the assignment of copyright set out in this section shall cease to be effective, and all rights assigned by me to IAFFE in relation to the Contribution shall revert to me.

2 CONDITIONS OF PUBLICATION

I represent and warrant to IAFFE that the Contribution is my original work, has not been published previously, that I have obtained all necessary permissions for the reproduction, as part of the Contribution, of any other copyright works, including artistic works (e.g., photographs, diagrams, maps, etc.) not owned by me; that I have paid any required fees for these permissions; that the Contribution contains nothing libelous, defamatory, obscene, or fraudulent; does not violate or infringe any duty of confidentiality or any other rights of third parties, including privacy rights; that any recipe, formula, or instruction contained in it will not, if properly followed, cause any illness or damage to the user or any other person and that the Contribution contains appropriate warnings; and that the Contribution has not been previously assigned or licensed by me to any third party and that I will undertake that it not be published elsewhere without IAFFE's prior written consent. I agree to indemnify and hold harmless IAFFE and the publisher and their respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and representatives against any losses, damages, or claims in respect of any breach or alleged breach of any of the foregoing representations and warranties.

I understand that IAFFE reserves the right to make such editorial changes as it deems appropriate to make the Contribution suitable for publication or as it considers necessary to avoid infringing third-party rights or law, and it reserves the right not to proceed with publication for whatever

reason. If the Contribution was prepared jointly with other authors, I warrant that I have been authorized by all co-authors to sign this Agreement and that all co-authors agree on the order of names in the publication of the Contribution.

3 PUBLICATION OF WORKING PAPERS

(i) Contributor shall have the right to post an electronic “preprint” of an unpublished Contribution (i.e., a version created prior to peer review) on Contributor’s website or on Contributor’s institution’s intranet, provided that any such posting is accompanied by the following acknowledgement or such other acknowledgement as IAFFE may require:

“This is a preprint of an article submitted for consideration in *Feminist Economics* © [year of publication] [International Association for Feminist Economics]; *Feminist Economics* is available online at [URL].”

(ii) Following publication of the Contribution in the Journal, Contributor may retain an electronic preprint version of the Contribution, provided that it is accompanied by the following acknowledgement or such other acknowledgement as IAFFE may require:

“This is a preprint of an article that has been published in final form in *Feminist Economics* © [year of publication] [International Association for Feminist Economics]; *Feminist Economics* is available online at [URL].”

(iii) Contributor shall have the right to post a “postprint” of the Contribution (i.e., a pdf, provided by the editor upon request, of the Contribution in the form accepted for publication in the Journal following peer review and final editing but not the final article as published in the Journal) on Contributor’s website or on Contributor’s institution’s intranet for personal or professional use but not for commercial sale or for any systematic external distribution by a third party (such as a listserv or database connected to a public access server), provided that Contributor includes any amendments or deletions or warnings relating to the Contribution issued or published by the Journal or IAFFE, and further provided that any such posting is accompanied by the following acknowledgement or such other acknowledgement as IAFFE may require:

“This is an electronic version of an article published in [include complete citation information for the final version of the article as published in the print edition of the Journal]; *Feminist Economics* is available online at [URL].”

The right set forth in this paragraph 3(iii) is subject to an embargo of 18

months after first publication in the Journal (whether in print or electronic form).

4 RIGHTS RETAINED BY CONTRIBUTOR

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, Contributor retains the following rights in the Contribution as published in the Journal:

(i) the right to make printed copies of all or part of the article for teaching purposes, provided that such copies are not offered for sale or distributed in any systematic way, and further provided that explicit acknowledgement of prior publication in the Journal is made. For avoidance of doubt, Contributor may use a pdf version of the article in teaching and may post it on e-reserves so long as it is only made available within Contributor's institution. (Contributor acknowledges, however, the Journal's preference that students be directed to download the article from the website of Contributor's institution's website.)

(ii) the right to include the article in a thesis or dissertation that is not published commercially, provided that explicit acknowledgement of prior publication in the Journal is made.

(iii) the right to expand the article into book form for publication, provided that explicit acknowledgement of prior publication in the Journal is made.

5 MISCELLANEOUS

(i) The publisher will send proofs of the article to the Contributor, who will correct them and return them to the editor of the Journal by the specified date. If corrected proofs are not received by the specified date, the editor's corrections will be considered as final. (In the case of co-authored contributions, proofs will be sent to the first named author unless the publisher is otherwise instructed.)

(ii) The publisher will send Contributor (or each of them) one free copy of the issue in which the article appears, together with a pdf of the Contribution. Book Reviewers will receive a pdf of the entire book review section. Alternatively, authors may request 50 free offprints of their contribution, or, in the case of Book Reviewers, 50 offprints of the entire book review section. (In the case of co-authored Contributions, offprints must be shared and will be sent to the first named author unless the publisher is otherwise instructed.)

(iii) The Contributor may include the Contribution in a volume of the Contributor's own collected papers without charge and without seeking

permission from the publisher, provided that 12 months shall have elapsed since the publication of the issue of the Journal containing the Contribution. Due acknowledgment to the Journal must be made in any such collection by acknowledging prior publication in *Feminist Economics* and by including the standard copyright line © [year] International Association for Feminist Economics (IAFFE).

(iv) This agreement (and any dispute, proceeding, claim, or controversy in relation to it) is subject to Texas law and the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts of Texas. It may only be amended by a document signed by both of us.

IAFFE Copyright Information

- 1 IAFFE's policy is to own copyright in all Contributions *Feminist Economics*.

There are two reasons for this:

(a) ownership of copyright by IAFFE ensures maximum protection against piratical infringement anywhere in the world;

(b) it also ensures that requests by third parties to reprint a contribution, or part of it, are handled efficiently in accordance with our general policy which encourages dissemination of knowledge inside the framework of copyright.

- 2 We will not withhold permission for any reasonable request from you to publish the whole or any part of your Contribution in connection with any other work by you, provided the usual acknowledgements are given regarding copyright notice and reference to first publication by IAFFE.

- 3 (a) You will be informed, wherever practicable, of all requests to reprint your Contribution, or a substantial part of it, in anthologies or other printed works.

(b) Publisher will make the necessary arrangements, whether they themselves or through their agents, to place the Contribution in electronic storage so that it may be transmitted to meet legitimate requests for access including transmission in a document delivery service.

- 4 Publisher mandates the Copyright Clearance Center in the USA, and the Copyright Licensing Agency in the UK, each of which offers centralized licensing arrangements for photocopying in their respective territories.
